Sport and Recreation Disaster Recovery Program

<u>Aim</u>

The program has funding available for eligible sport and active recreation organisations located in areas declared under the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements

Amount

A grant of up to \$5000 is available for eligible items

Note

To be eligible, organisations must:

- be located in an DRFA Category A to B declared disaster affected area
- be an incorporated not-for-profit organisation with a primary objective relating to the delivery of local or regional sport and active recreation
- demonstrate tenure over the infrastructure and have the legal right to conduct works on the site to request repair, restoration or mitigation support to infrastructure damaged by the declared natural event

Round 1 - support projects valued up to \$1 million with a maximum grant of \$450,000

Active Community Infrastructure

Aim

Provide fit-for-purpose, universally designed infrastructure to communities that need it most

Note

To be eligible, organisations should demonstrate:

- community collaboration by connecting clubs and organisations to each other and the broader community
- support diverse and inclusive needs, such as women and girls, LGBTIQ+ community, seniors and people with disability
- activate community spaces to encourage more Queenslanders to get more active, more often

FEMALE

Investing in Queensland Women Grant

Aim

Supports community groups and organisations across Queensland's urban, rural and remote regions with resources to lead projects and events designed to create positive change for women and girls

Calendar

Pround 2 of the grant program will open in the latter half of 2023

Amount

A total allocation of \$540,000 per annum (ex GST) will be made available through 2 grant rounds of \$270,000 (ex GST) each

Note

Organisations may submit 1 application per round

The application will be considered under 1 of the following categories:

- Category 1: Up to \$5,000 for small scale projects and/or events (e.g. an awareness-raising event, a workshop or a training session, or development of basic resources)
- Category 2: Up to \$10,000 for larger scale projects and/or events involving a larger audience or multiple events, or with longer term impacts (e.g. a series of workshops or events, a set of resources to be used well into the future, a medium to large scale awareness-raising campaign)
- Category 3: Up to \$15,000 for more substantial initiatives involving multiple elements, which may be delivered jointly between 2 or more organisations or community groups. Partnerships may include cash contributions and/or inkind contributions.

Deadly Active Sport & Recreation Program

Aim

Funding is available to support the 17 discrete Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities from 1 July 2022 to 30 June 2025

Focused on projects that address community-identified and prioritised physical activity needs. Projects will support the delivery of quality and culturally appropriate physical activities to increase physical activity participation

INDIVIDUAL

AIS Local Sporting Champions Program

Aim

Provides financial assistance for coaches, officials and competitors aged 12-18 participating in state, national or international championships

Calendar

Open - Thursday,1st June - Closes - Monday, 31st July, 2023

Amount

- Base Grant: \$500
- Applicants travelling 800km 1999km to their nominated championships: + \$100
- Applicants travelling internationally or greater than 2000km to their nominated championships: + \$200
- Applicants residing in a rural electorate: + \$50

Emerging Athlete Pathways

Aim

Supports eligible young athletes, coaches and officials aged 10-18 years to progress on a development pathway by providing financial assistance to help alleviate the costs associated with attending state, national and international events

Calendar

Applications can be made from time of selection up until 6 months after the event start date

Amount

- State or state school event \$500
- National or national school event \$600
- International event \$800

Note

Applicants will be required to provide documentation clearly demonstrating selection with their application

Fair Play Vouchers

Aim

Parents, carers or guardians can apply for a voucher for their child, which can be used towards sport and active recreation membership, registration or participation fees with registered activity providers

Calendar

- Wednesday, 4th October, Round 9 closes
- Wednesday, 22nd November, last day for vouchers to be presented

Up to \$150

Note

Can only be redeemed with an Activity Provider as listed on the Activity Provider directory. The Department will not honour Vouchers redeemed with a non-registered provider;

Can only be used for membership, registration or participation fees for an Eligible Activity up to \$150 and not for any other individual or associated items including but not limited to jerseys, boots, playing equipment or travelling costs

MULTICULTURAL

Celebrating Multicultural Queensland Program

Aim

Provides funding towards multicultural events and projects that engage culturally diverse communities, groups and individuals, and the broader community, to partner and contribute to building an inclusive, harmonious and united Queensland

The Department of Children, Youth Justice and Multicultural Affairs acknowledges the cultural diversity of First Nations peoples. However, for the purposes of the CMQ program, the term 'culturally diverse' refers to people from migrant and refugee backgrounds, people seeking asylum, and Australian South Sea Islander peoples

Calendar

Opens – Thursday, 1st June – Closes – Thursday, 13th July 2023

Funding rounds – opens 1 June and close 13 July each year for events to be delivered in the following calendar year, for example:

- Funding round opening on 1 June 2023 is for events to be delivered in 2024
- Funding round opening on 1 June 2024 is for events to be delivered in 2025
